What is MythTV? “MythTV is a free Linux application with a simplified ‘10-foot user interface’ design for the living-room TV, and turns a computer with the necessary hardware into a network streaming digital video recorder, a digital multimedia home entertainment system, or Home Theater Personal Computer. It can be considered as a free and open source alternative to Tivo or Windows Media Center.”
